



RULES FOR THE > PAQUITA MADRIGUERA MUSICAL COMPOSITION PRIZE 2018

Igualada town council and the municipal music school/conservatory, with the collaboration of the Catalan association of music schools ACEM, announce the “Paquita Madriguera” Musical composition prize, with the aim of fostering musical creativity and paying homage to this performer and composer.

As a novelty of this year, the call will focus on the areas that the pianist, composer and interpreter Paquita Madriguera cultivated.

A single category of participation is established, for works of a maximum duration of 7 minutes, composed for solo piano or guitar, voice with piano or guitar, trio of voice piano and guitar, with freedom of style and difficulty level average. Priority will be assessed, in addition to artistic quality, that the difficulty of the work is adequate to be interpreted by the students of Music Schools and Professional Degree Conservatories. The work presented may consist of one or more parts provided that the set does not exceed the maximum established duration.

Rules:

1. It is open to all composers who wish to enter, with no restrictions on age or nationality. Works must be unpublished and unperformed, and cannot have won prizes in any other competitions.
2. Works can be submitted by email, with a title. The author's name, address and telephone number must be included in the body of the message, and the secretary will ensure anonymity. The author's identity card or passport must be attached in pdf or jpg format. The score must be submitted in pdf, Finale or equivalent format, maintaining anonymity, suitable for immediate publication. An audio file of the work must also be attached. All the above must be sent to the address culturaigualada@gmail.com. Optionally, the score may be sent on paper, with a CD containing the different files specified, all in quintuplicate. Works submitted must be under *Creative Commons* (by-nc-sa)* licences.
3. The deadline for submitting works is **21st September 2018**. Works should be submitted to the Department of Cultural Development (Plaça de Sant Miquel, 12, 2n, 08700 Igualada) by registered post, email or in person, from Monday to Friday, between 8am and 3pm.



4. **The “Ciutat d’Igualada” prize will be awarded, together with €1,350** for copyright. Moreover, the town council will produce a commemorative edition of the work, with a CD that includes: the score, the partitions and the audio track, which will be distributed, among others, in the music schools and conservatories of Catalonia the year after the awarding of the prize. The work will be recorded and will be included in the educational content portal www.freeangle.org promoted and managed by ACEM.
5. This year's winner cannot enter for the next edition of the prize, and will be invited to sit on the jury.
6. Compositions will be considered by a jury made up of musicians of recognised prestige and teaching experience, a representative of the Igualada municipal music school/conservatory, a representative of the ACEM and the previous year's winner.
7. The jury's verdict will be final; it may award special commendations without any economic value, recommend publication of the works in question or declare the prize unawarded.
8. **The winner will be announced and the prize awarded on 18th November 2018**, at the Ciutat d’Igualada awards event.
9. Should the winner or their legal representative fail to collect the prize during the award event, they will lose all right to it. The winning composer undertakes to perform at the premiere of the work on the day the prize is awarded.
10. The Catalan association of music schools ACEM will promote and disseminate this work in its member schools.
11. Entry to the competition implies full agreement to these rules. Any matters not regulated herein will be settled by the organisers of the Ciutat d’Igualada awards.

PAQUITA MADRIGUERA I RODON

PIANIST and COMPOSER

Igualada, 1900 - Montevideo, 1965

She started playing the piano at the age of three. She studied with Enric Granados, the maestro Frank Marshall and Isidor Philipp. In 1912 she was accepted as a concert pianist at the Palau de la Música Catalana. At a very early age she gave concerts in Madrid, London and Paris. In 1915 she left for America and gave concerts in New York and the main capitals of North and South America.

By the time she was eighteen she had written thirty-five compositions.

After giving up her musical career when she married Arturo Puig in Montevideo, she resumed it when she was widowed and gave concerts with the Pau Casals orchestra, among others.

She married a second time, this time with the great Spanish guitarist Andrés Segovia.

Her compositions for piano and voice include: Capvespre d'estiu (Summer Evening), Non non, La boda índia (The Indian Wedding), El canto del grillo (The Song of the Cricket), Pastoral, Atalaya (Watchtower), Serenata aragonesa (Aragonese Serenade), El petit regiment (The Little Regiment) and Enyorant en Patufet (Missing Patufet), among others.
